AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S LIGHT WEIGHT FOUR-OARED CHAMPIOI SHIP

Last year The Australian Women's Rowing Council decided to expand the program of events for Australian Championships to cater for the increasing number of girls in the sport now.

The event finally decided upon which should be introduced was the Lightweight Four.

The weight limit for this event is an average weight per competitor of 9 stone but 50% of the crew may weigh up to 9 st. 3 lbs.

We are hopeful of this event being an interesting one and an event which will increase activity in the lightweight classes in each State.

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S SINGLE SCULLS CHAMPIONSHIP

This event was first contested in Brisbane, in 1963 and has been held each year since then.
