In 1968 the first Australian Women's Lightweight Four Oared Championship was contested in Melbourne.

It was due to the efforts of Mrs. Margaret MacKenzie (Nee Agnew) Secretary of the Australian Women's Rowing Council that Lightweight competition was introduced to the Championship programme.

The weight limit for this event is an average weight per competitor of 9 stones but 50% of the crew may weigh up to 9 stones 3 lbs.

Interest in lightweight competition has increased greatly. A large number of the girls participating in regular local competition are eligible for lightweight races and take part at all standards from Maiden to Senior class.

The introduction of this Championship event means many more girls have the opportunity to represent their State.

At present there are no lightweight events in the women's European Championships or on the proposed Olympic Programme, however it provides a vital link in our local rowing schedule to foster interest and provide the facility for top class competition for a large number of oarswomen.

The trophy for the event, 'The Victoria Cup' was presented by the Victorian Ladies Rowing Association.

AUSTRALIAN WOMEN'S  
SINGLE SCULLS CHAMPIONSHIP  
FOR  
THE NELL SLATTER TROPHY

The first interstate women's sculling race was staged many years before the Australian Women's Single Sculls Championship was introduced in 1963.

In 1901, women's Interstate sculling race was held on Albert Park Lake, Melbourne. The regatta was one of the many festivities organised to celebrate Federation. Contestants were from Victoria and one Sydney sculler also participated.

The event was won by Mrs. Cassie McRitchie in an open style skiff which is still housed at a Victorian women's rowing club. The trophy of rubies and pearls set in a gold bracelet, was presented to the winning sculler by the Duke and Duchess of Gloucester.

From that date organised sculling competition at Interstate level lapsed until the Australian Women's Rowing Council decided to add the Championship event to their Annual programme in 1963. The first Australian Women's Sculling Championship was staged at Brisbane and the perpetual trophy known as the Nell Slatter Trophy was donated by the Queensland Women's Rowing Association.

Since its introduction at Australian Championship level there has been increased activity and regular competition for scullers at local regattas with a consequent rise in standard.

Last year, Queensland sculler, Mrs. Shirley Graham was named to represent Australia at the European Championships. Her sculling performances proved that Australian crews can worthily compete against International competition and augures well for our future in Olympic competition.

Hamilton Reach, Brisbane River, Brisbane was the venue for the first women's interstate rowing Championship. The event was conducted in conjunction with the Kings Cup on 15th May 1920. The Australian Women's Rowing Council was formed that same year.

A crew from Mannum on the Murray River, won the first event for South Australia, ahead of representatives crews from two other States.

Competition has continued annually since 1920 with the exception of the years 1942 - 48 during and immediately following World War II.

The first two races were conducted over three quarters of a mile. From 1922 - 1937 the race was over half a mile. The distance reverted to three quarters of a mile between 1939 - 1959. Since 1960 the race has been rowed over 1000 metres.

International crews have twice previously competed in the Australian Women's Four Oared Championship. In 1938 an English four toured a number of States and won the Championship race in Sydney. However the resident Championship went to the runners-up from Tasmania. The second International team to win the race was New Zealand in 1966. This time the Victorian crew became resident titleholders.

Since the inception of this event a high standard of rowing has been maintained and there have been many closely fought races including one dead heat between New South Wales and Victoria in 1955. Members of both crews were so completely exhausted that a re-row could not take place until the following day, but was won by the New South Wales crew.

The unique Championship trophy was presented by the Queensland Licensed Victuallers Association in 1920. The sterling silver trophy was modelled from 100 silver guineas. Atop the trophy stands a young oarswoman holding her oar.

The statue was modelled after the stroke of the South Australian crew who won the first race. The rowing uniform in this day was black lace up shoes, black stockings, billowy bloomers, a midi-sailor style shirt and a floppy hat. The trophy has become affectionately known to Australian oarswomen as 'Bertha'.

## NATIONAL CLUB CHAMPIONSHIPS

National Championships were introduced in 1968 and have been conducted each year since.

While the Australian Championships may be contested by only one selected representative crew from each affiliated State the National Championship events are open to club and composite crews.

National Championships may be held on the same course and on the same day or day following the Australian Championships.

The name was changed to National Club Championships to clearly define the role of these events and to illustrate the difference between these and the Australian Championships.

Since their introduction interest has steadily grown until now a great number of oarswomen contest each National Club Championship event. Of particular benefit have been, the Junior class events, where the high standard of competition has stimulated interest and provided the incentive for girls to continue in the sport and aim to reach Senior class.

In 1972 the Australian Women's Rowing Council formulated a long term plan to gradually expand the National Club Championship programme and widen our competition to include all events of European and Olympic programmes.

This plan has provided for the introduction of coxless senior pair events of which there are two on this years programme - a senior pair and a lightweight senior pair.

In devising the plan the Council considered the lack of immediate funds and equipment available to clubs. This far sighted programme allows clubs to plan acquisition of new equipment and introduction of competition in each event. Boats suitable for coxless pair events may also be suitable for double sculling events which are planned as the next new class of boat for introduction.

It will be continued enthusiastic support for, and expansion of, our National competition programme which will contribute in large part to our ability to meet our International counterparts in competition and admirably represent Australian women's rowing.
