# The National Regatta of 1964

The staging of the National Regatta of 1964 on the newly-constructed Lake Burley Griffin at Canberra on 30th April to 2nd May, 1964, is of very special significance and marks a new era for rowing in the Australian Capital Territory.

It will be the first official major aquatic carnival held on the Lake and will be used to celebrate the opening of what is destined to become one of the main attractions in the National Capital, and the scene of future National and International contests.

Great importance is being placed on the results of events to be decided at this first regatta as many of the races are trials to decide the crews which will be nominated to represent Australia at the Olympic Games in Tokyo next October.

Entries have been received from all States of the Commonwealth, from the Australian Capital Territory and New Zealand, and these will include schoolboy crews representing five States. The entries are such that twenty-one heats will be necessary on Thursday, with twenty-four repechage heats and semi-finals on Friday and ten finals on Saturday.

The New South Wales Rowing Association takes this opportunity of wishing the newly-formed A.C.T. Rowing Association every success in the future and offering our sincere thanks to the Officers of the Department of the Interior, the National Capital Development Commission, the Canberra Junior Chamber, the Canberra Tourist Bureau, Mr. R. J. M. Luker, Chairman of the A.C.T. Rowing Association and the other rowing enthusiasts who have made it possible for this National Regatta to be held on Lake Burley Griffin.

# Notice to Competitors

**Competitors must be at their Stations FIVE minutes before time appointed for starting.**

Signals to Start and Finish shall be by GUNFIRE.

If the Starter considers the start unsatisfactory, he may, within ten seconds thereafter, recall the competitors to their stations, and any competitor refusing to start again shall be disqualified. The signal recalling competitors shall be one gunshot.

In the event of any breakage of an oar or boat fittings during the first half minute's rowing, the race shall be stopped and re-started from the original starting point.

Any crew or sculler leaving its or his true course during the race, and thereby impeding by its or his wash or otherwise any other competing crew or sculler, shall be liable to disqualification. A boat's true course is the shortest way to the winning post, leaving room for all opposing boats to come up level in the position in which they started.

Waving of a red flag by the Umpire shall be the signal to stop rowing should the Umpire wish to stop the race.

STARTING STATIONS are numbered from the Canberra Yacht Club Bank.

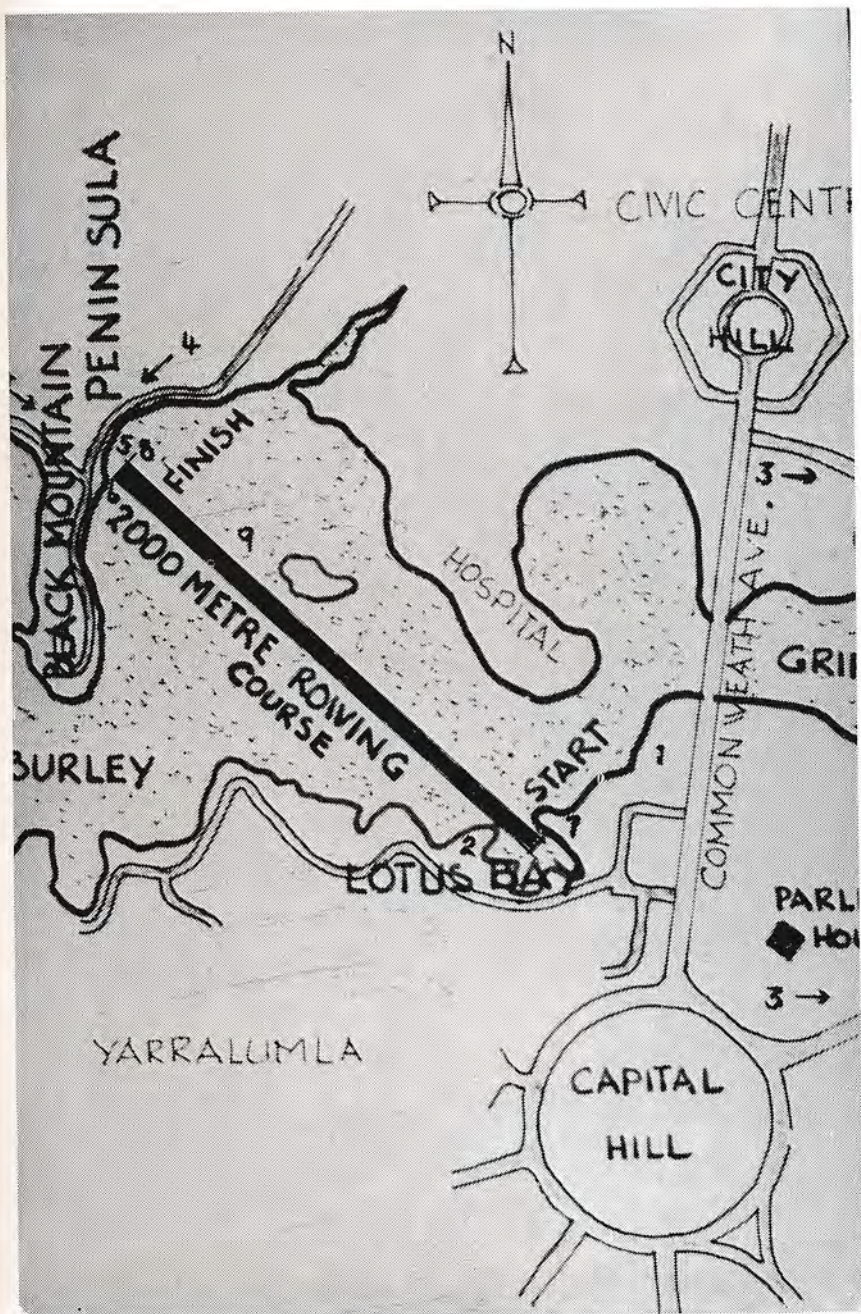
