

Message of Welcome

The Australian Rowing Championships are the showpiece of the sport of rowing in this country. Wherever the Championships are held, they provide a compelling focus for rowing competitors, coaches and supporters throughout Australia.

On this occasion, Perth's Canning River will be the venue for 240 crews from six States and the Australian Capital Territory, who will contest 41 titles in school, youth, lightweight, senior B and senior A categories in the National Regatta to be held on 6—9 April. In addition, 36 crews will contest seven interstate events in the King's Cup Regatta on Monday 10 April.

An enormous amount of planning and organization goes into staging the championships each year and 1983 is no exception. It is to the credit of each State Rowing Association in turn that they rise to the challenge of mounting the national and interstate regattas at a standard befitting the illustrious King's Cup.

Particular recognition should also be given to the dedicated body of Boat Race Officials who make the journey to the championships each year to ensure fair racing for the competitors.

The championships would not be the same if it were not for the many rowing enthusiasts including former outstanding oarsmen and oarswomen who attend the Australian titles each year. They help to make the championships a great social as well as sporting festival.

On behalf of the Australian Amateur Rowing Council, the Amateur Rowing Association of Western Australia, and the Organizing Committee of the 1983 Australian Rowing Championships, I extend a warm welcome—good rowing and good fellowship to everyone.

Status of Competitors

(a) Rowers are divided into the following classes:-

(i) School (ii) Junior (iii) Senior B (iv) Senior A (v) Lightweight (vi) Youth

- (b) A School competitor is one who is attending a secondary school as a full time student and representing his/her school. This definition also applies to the coxswain of the school crew:
- (c) A Competitor ceases to be a Junior on December 31 of the year which he/she reaches the age of eighteen. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Junior Crew.
- (d) A Rower ceases to be a Senior B on December 31 of the year in which he/she reaches the age of twenty two. After that date he/she shall be classified as Senior A.
- (e) Lightweight races are restricted to male rowers weighing 72½ kilograms or less and female rowers weighing 59 kilograms or less in the case of single sculling races and in all other classes of boat to male rowers weighing 72½ kilograms or less and female rowers weighing 59 kilograms or less provided that the average weight of all members of the crew in which such rower races (excluding the coxswain) does not exceed 70 kilograms in the case of male rowers and 57 kilograms in the case of female rowers;
- (f) All Rowers shall be eligible to compete in Senior A category or in Australian Championships (in the appropriate weight division) and a Junior rower may compete in Senior B category (in the appropriate weight division);
- (g) Coxswains shall be deemed to be members of the crew. A women's crew may not therefore be steered by a man nor may a men's crew be steered by a woman. There shall be no age limit for coxswains in races for senior crews. The minimumweight for a coxswain is 50 kg for men and 45 kg for women and juniors provided that the minimum weight for the coxswain of a lighweight women's crew when entered in a lightweight event is 40 kg. To make up this weight a coxswain shall carry dead-weight including the weight of clothing and equipment but not including the weight of electrical amplifying equipment. This dead-weight shall be placed in the boat as close as possible to the coxswain;
- (h) Coxswains shall be weighed by a person duly authorised by the Organising Committee conducting the Regatta not more than two hours and not less than one hour before their first race in any regatta. Immediately after the race the coxswain of the winning crew together with the dead-weight carried (if any) shall again be weighed by a person duly authorised by the Organising Committee conducting the regatta;
- (i) All Crews have the right to replace up to fifty percent (50%) of their rowers and the coxswain as well provided that a written declaration of the names and status of any such replacements be presented at least one hour before the race to the Organising Committee who must mention the substitution in their official report. No substitute is permitted for a single sculler;
- (j) No Competitor may race for 2 different clubs at the same regatta but a competitor may represent his/her State and his/her Club and his/her School at a regatta;
- (k) Notwithstanding the provisions of Art.5.10(j) a coxswain may steer for any number of Clubs at a regatta;
- (l) No Change may be made in a crew which has already raced in a heat of its event except in the case of serious illness or accident in which case a medical cer-

tificate shall be tendered to the Referee and the Jury shall determine whether such a change shall be permitted;

- (m) **Lightweight** competitors shall be weighed by a person duly appointed by the Organising Committee conducting the Regatta not more than two hours and not less than one hour before the race on each day of racing;
- (n) An Oarsman may row in Youth events up to June 30 following his 19th birthday. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Youth crew.

Notice to Competitors

Competitors must be in their starting positions at least two minutes before the time laid down for the start of their event.

Late arrivals at the start:

The Starter may warn or exclude from the race any crew arriving at its starting position less than two minutes before the starting time. A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start.

Starting procedure:

As soon as the Judge at the Start indicates that the boats are properly aligned, the Starter raises a red flag — the Starter shall give the warning command "Are you ready?" and, at after a clearly marked pause, the starting command "Go!" at the same time lowering the red flag to one side.

False start:

If a crew starts too soon, the Starter stops the race by ringing a bell and then waving a red flag. In the case of a false start the Starter warns the crew or crews at fault. A crew causing two false starts shall be excluded from the race.

Equipment damage:

If a crew while still in the first 100 metres of the race indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment, the Starter or Umpire stops the race. The signal by an Umpire to stop the race shall be by ringing a bell and waving a red flag.

Umpire's directions:

The Umpire may not steer a crew unless there is an obstacle in its lane. If a crew is about to impede another by its wash or by leaving its lane, the Umpire raises a white flag and calls to the crew at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side. If a crew is about to cause a collision, the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command "STOP". Crews interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race.

The finish:

The Judges shall indicate the crossing of the line, by the winning crew, by a gun shot. Other crews crossing the finish line shall be signalled by a hooter sounding.

Lane numbering:

Lane No. 1 is on the side nearest the Judges at the finish. All boats must have the appropriate lane number disc in position on the bow when racing.
