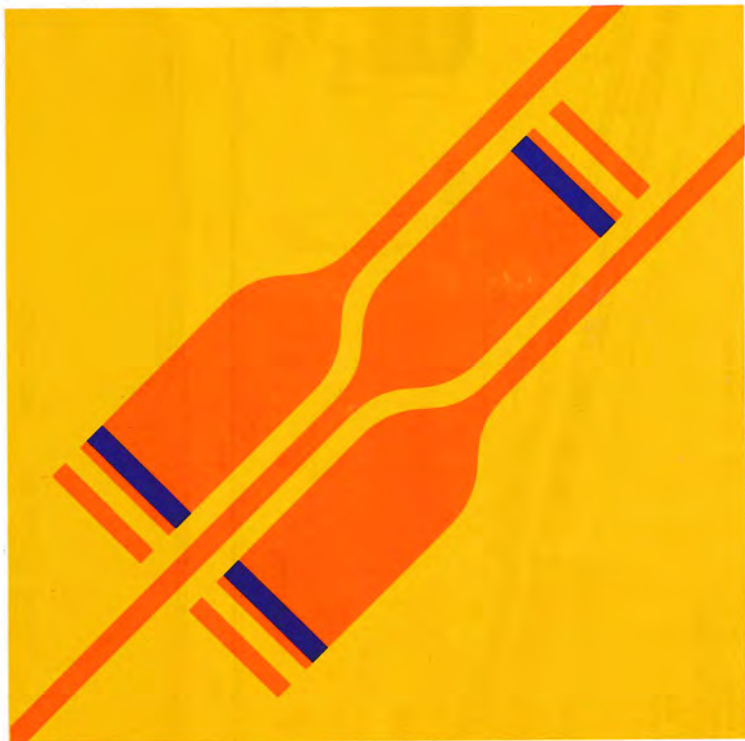

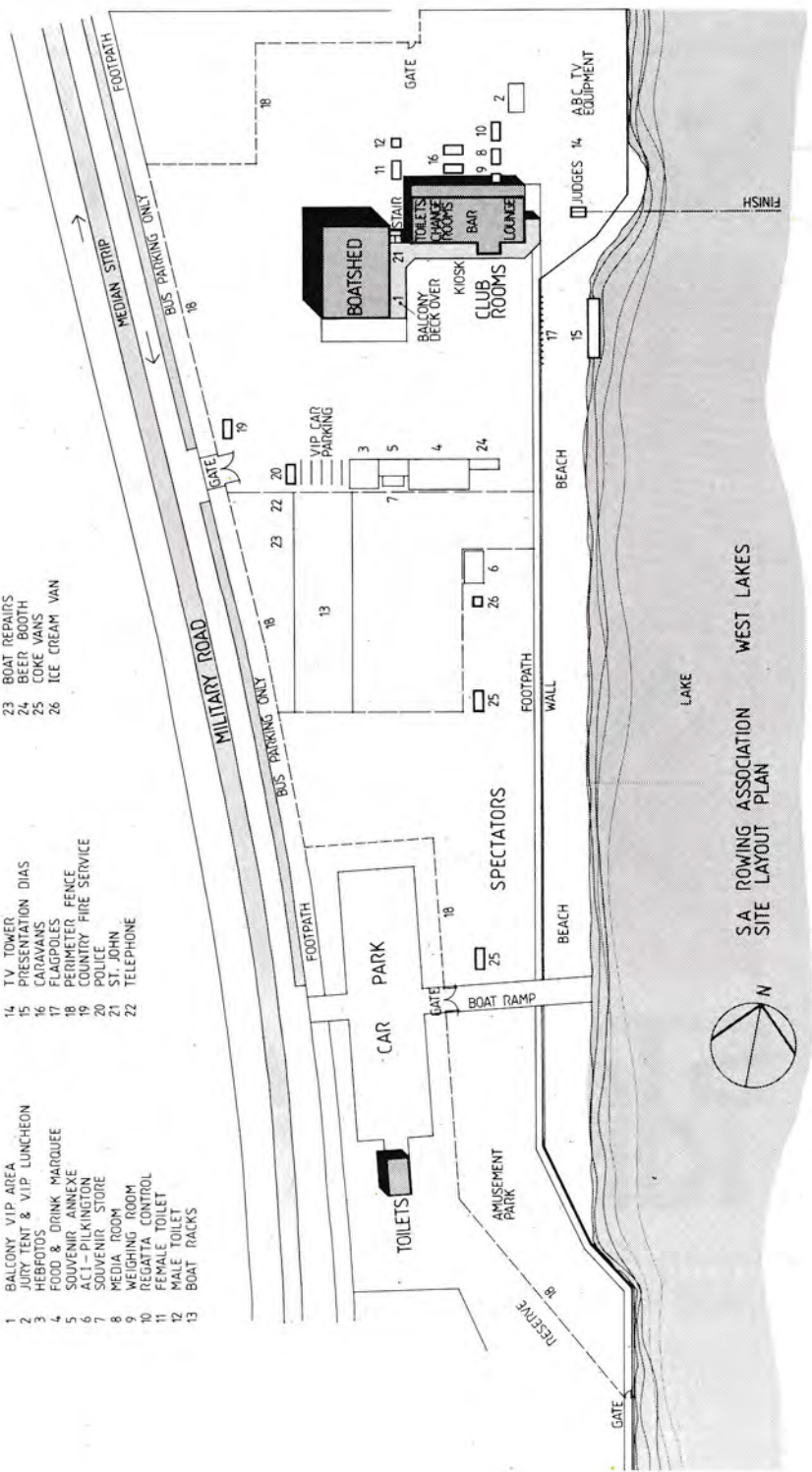

To all participants and supporters of the 1986 King's Cup Regatta and National Rowing Titles I extend a warm welcome to South Australia in our Jubilee 150 year.

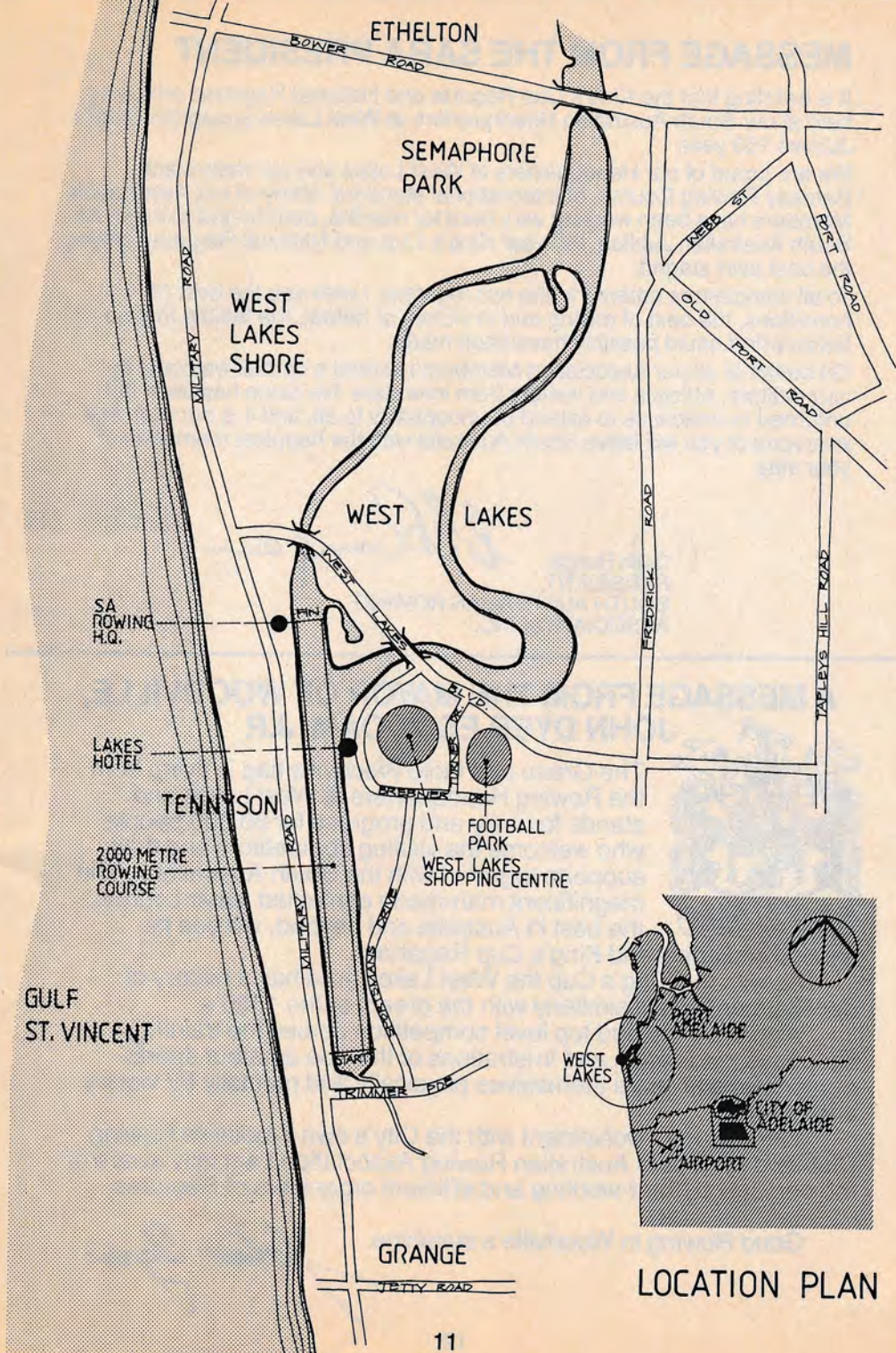

A MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR OF WOODVILLE, JOHN DYER ESQ., OAM, J.P.





• HISTORY OF THE KING'S CUP •

This year marks the 67th anniversary of Australia's most famous rowing trophy, the King's Cup, which is presented for the Australian eight-oared championship.

It is appropriate that this competition is being rowed in this, South Australia's Jubilee 150 year, for it was a South Australian crew which first won it in competition between the States.

Although the championship competition between States has been conducted since 1878 when it was rowed on the Lower Yarra in Victoria, the King's Cup was first presented in the United Kingdom in 1919 by King George V for an eight-oared race between crews selected from the Allied Armies which fought in the 1914-18 war. The competition between the countries took place at the Henley Regatta conducted on the River Thames from July 2 to 4, 1919. Two crews from Australia as well as crews from Canada, France, New Zealand, the United States, Oxford University and Cambridge University participated.

Australia's AIF No. 1 crew won the trophy which was eventually handed by the Australian military authorities to the Australian War Memorial Council which placed it in the Australian Museum.

Following a petition to the King, prepared by the Victorian Rowing Association and signed by Captain H. C. Disher, Stroke of the AIF No. 1 Crew which won the trophy for Australia, the Secretary of State for the Colonies, Mr. Winston S. Churchill, advised that 'His Majesty commands me to inform you that it is his wish that the Cup should be used as a permanent trophy and be competed for annually in the Interstate Eight-oared Races of Australia.'

• NOTICE TO COMPETITORS •

STARTING TIMES

Competitors must be at their starting positions at least two minutes before the time laid down for the start of their event.

LATE ARRIVALS

The Starter may warn any crew arriving at its starting position less than two minutes before the start time of their event. A warning has the same effect as one given for a false start. The Starter may exclude a crew arriving after the start time.

STARTING PROCEDURE

As soon as the Judge at the start indicates that the boats are properly aligned the Starter raises a red flag. After making sure that all crews are ready the Starter gives the warning command "ARE YOU READY?" and, after a clearly marked pause, the starting command "GO!", at the same time quickly lowering the red flag to one side.

FALSE START

If a crew starts too soon the Starter stops the race by ringing a bell and then waving a red flag. In the case of a false start the Starter warns the crew or crews at fault. The starter excludes from the race a crew causing two false starts.

EQUIPMENT DAMAGE

If a crew, while still in the first 100 metres of the race, indicates that it has suffered damage to its boat or equipment the Starter or Umpire stops the race by ringing a bell and waving a red flag.

UMPIRE'S DIRECTIONS

The Umpire may not steer a crew unless there is an obstacle in its lane. If a crew is about to impede another by its wash or by leaving its lane the Umpire raises a white flag and calls to the crew at fault, indicating the required change of direction by lowering the flag to one side. If a crew is about to cause a collision the Umpire may call its attention by raising the white flag and stop it by giving the command "STOP". Crews interfering with their opponents may be excluded from the race by the Umpire.

PROTESTS

Except in unavoidable circumstances a crew claiming that its race has been improperly run must make its protest to a member of the Jury immediately after the finish of the race and before getting out of the boat. A representative of such crew shall confirm any such protest in writing to the Jury within one hour of the completion of the race concerned setting out the reasons for the protest and lodging the sum of twenty dollars with the Jury.

LANE NUMBERS

All boats must have the appropriate lane number disc in position on the bow when racing. Discs will be supplied at the launching beach by a Regatta Official and must be returned immediately after use.

WEIGHING OF LIGHTWEIGHTS AND COXSWAINS

A Regatta Official will be on duty at the weighing-in room to weigh coxswains and lightweights not more than two hours and not less than one hour before their first race on each day of racing. Immediately after the race the coxswain of the winning crew together with deadweight carried (if any) shall again be weighed by a Regatta Official.

• STATUS OF COMPETITORS •

SCHOOL

A School competitor is one who is attending a secondary school as a full time day student and representing his/her school. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a School crew.

JUNIOR

A competitor ceases to be a Junior on 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of eighteen. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Junior crew.

YOUTH

An oarsman may row in Youth events up to the 30th June following his 19th birthday. This definition also applies to the coxswain of a Youth crew.

SENIOR B

A competitor ceases to be a Senior B on the 31st December of the year in which he/she reaches the age of twenty-two.

SENIOR A

All rowers shall be eligible to compete in Senior A crews.

LIGHTWEIGHT

Lightweight races are restricted to male rowers weighing 72.5kg or less and female rowers 59kg or less in the case of single sculling races and in all other classes of boats to male rowers weighing 72.5kg or less and female rowers 59kg or less provided that the average weight of all members of the crew in which such rower races (excluding the coxswain) does not exceed 70kg in the case of male rowers and 57kg in the case of female rowers.

COXSWAIN

Coxswains shall be deemed to be members of a crew. A women's crew may not be steered by a man nor may a men's crew be steered by a woman. There shall be no age limit for coxswains in events for Senior crews. The minimum weight for a coxwain is 50kg for men and youths and 45kg for women, schoolboys and schoolgirls provided that the minimum weight for the coxswain of a crew entered in a lightweight women's event is 40kg. To make up this weight a coxswain may carry deadweight. No article of racing equipment shall be considered as part of this deadweight which should be placed in the boat as close as possible to the coxswain.

SUBSTITUTIONS

All crews have the right to replace up to 50% of their rowers and the coxswain as well, provided that a written declaration of the names and status of any such replacements to be presented at least one hour before the race to the Organising Committee who must mention the substitution in their official report. No substitute is permitted for a single sculler except as provided in Rule 5.10. No change may be made in a crew which has already raced except as provided in Rule 5.10.

SCRATCHINGS

Scratchings must be notified to the Recorder not less than one hour before their respective event.

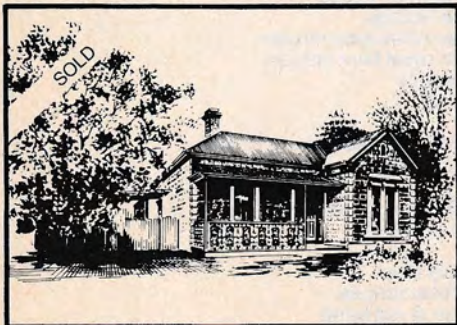

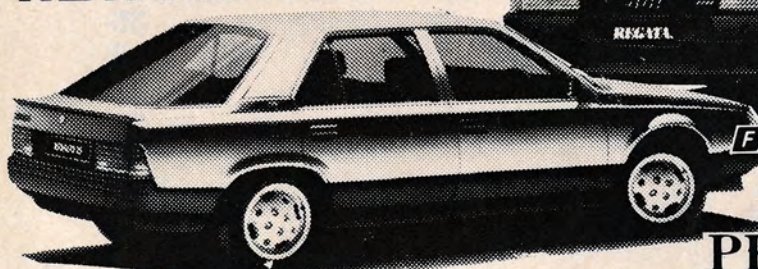
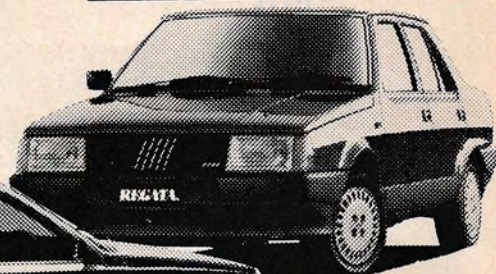
