

1927 Australian Ladies' Rowing Council meeting

1927 conference was held at Tamar Rowing Club, Trevallyn, Launceston. May 6, 1927

Attention was drawn to the fact that the affiliation of the Rockhampton and Tamar Ladies Rowing Clubs had not been approved by the delegates prior to the meeting but as a majority were present it was moved by Miss Thomas and seconded by Miss O'Malley that such approval be granted.

Regret at the unavoidable short notice of date of the 1927 race was expressed by the Tasmanian representative and the New South Vales motion "that in future at least two months notice be given to each state re date, etc. of interstate race was discussed, and on the motion of Miss O'Malley seconded by Miss Thomas put to the meeting and carried.

Miss Snodgrass on behalf of the Brisbane Ladies Rowing Club re-opened the question of the type or beats in which the Interstate race should be rowed, and whilst all present were unanimous in their support of racing clinkers it was decided that until such time as the States were prepared to provide their own boats, the decision would have to be left to the State holding the race for that year, but, that every endeavour be made to have the race rowed in Racing Clinkers.

It was proposed by Miss Blyth and seconded by Mrs. Fleming that each State's secretary or delegate be requested to supply to the Council's Secretary a report of their States activities for the twelve months, at least a fortnight prior to the Annual Conference for insertion in the Council's Annual Report.
