# HISTORY OF THE RACE

The Inter-Varsity Boat Race is one of the oldest-established races in this country, and is certainly one of the largest of its kind in the world.

The first Inter-Varsity race was rowed on December 20, 1870, between fours representing Sydney and Melbourne over a three-and-a-half-mile course on the Yarra. There is record of a boat race between representatives of the States of Victoria and New South Wales contested on the Parramatta River in 1863; but there does not seem to have been any other race of an interstate or international character prior to the Inter-Varsity race of 1870. This race was won by Melbourne in 31 minutes 4 seconds.

In the next year a Melbourne four again defeated Sydney, this time on the Parramatta course.

## START OF THE EIGHTS

The race was then abandoned until 1888 when eights representing Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide Universities met on the Victorian Harbour Reach course. Melbourne was first, with Adelaide second and Sydney third. The race has been rowed every year since 1888, except during the war years, 1915—1918.

Many well-known names are associated with the early years of this race. Sir John Grice (Chancellor of Melbourne University) rowed in the 1870 race. Mr. V. V. Nathan, who presented the trophy for Inter-Varsity rifle shooting, represented Sydney in 1904, and the Universities were also represented by such oarsmen as Dr. Disher (M.U.B.C.) (1912-13-14), who stroked the original A.I.F. crew which won the King's Cup, and Roger Fitzhardinge (S.U.B.C., 1912), who stroked the Australian Olympic crew at Stockholm in 1912.

## THE OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE CUP

In 1896 a most appropriate trophy was provided for the race, when Oxford and Cambridge "Blues" presented a cup as a perpetual trophy for the race. The historic value of such a trophy makes it unique in Inter-Varsity, if not Australian contests.

## QUEENSLAND

Until 1920, only Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide contested the race, but in this year Queensland sent to Melbourne a crew which finished third. In 1921 they came second, and won in 1922 and 1923. E. B. Freeman stroked both winning crews.

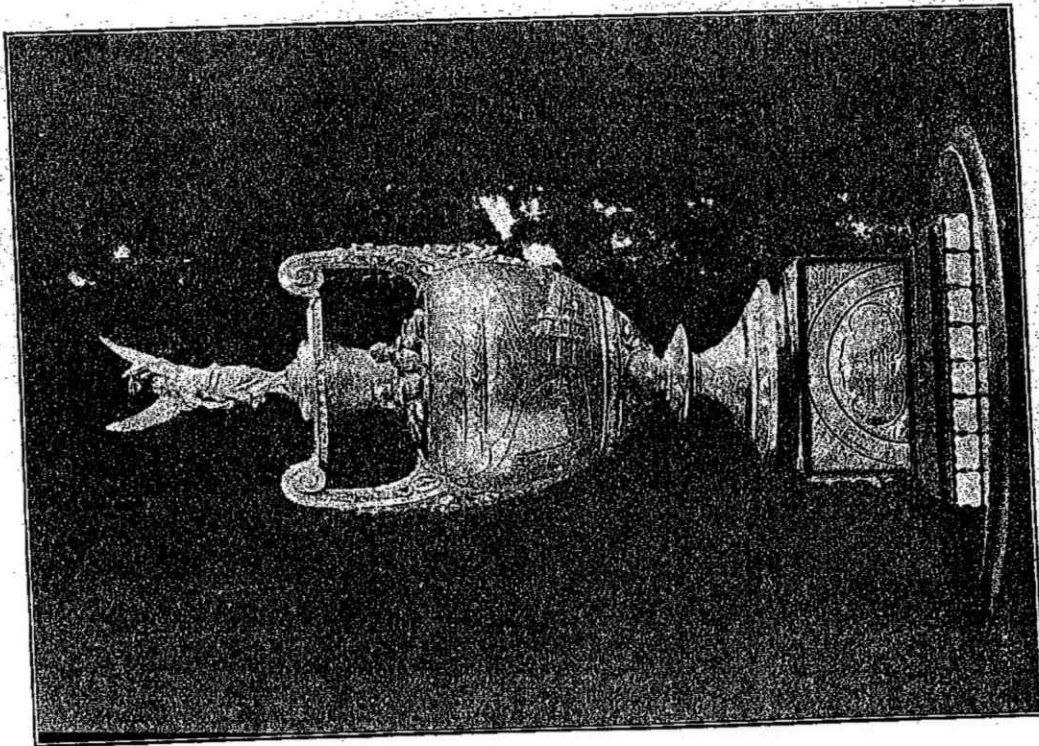
## TASMANIA

In 1924 Tasmania entered a crew, and in 1925 won the race from Sydney at Brisbane. R. A. Scott stroked the winning crew.

## PERTH

In 1927 Perth competed for the first time, when a crew stroked by F. A. Williams won on the Nepean River course in New South Wales. This was the first occasion on which a crew had won at its first start since the original race in 1870, and it was also the first occasion on which all six Australian Universities were represented in the race. In 1928 Perth again won; this time on the Murray River at Mannum, South Australia. The time for this race (16.43) was the fastest recorded over the full three miles since the war. This crew was stroked by O. F. Fry.

In 1929 Perth came fifth, when Melbourne, stroked by W. Sherlock, won on their home course. Since 1927 the race has been contested by all

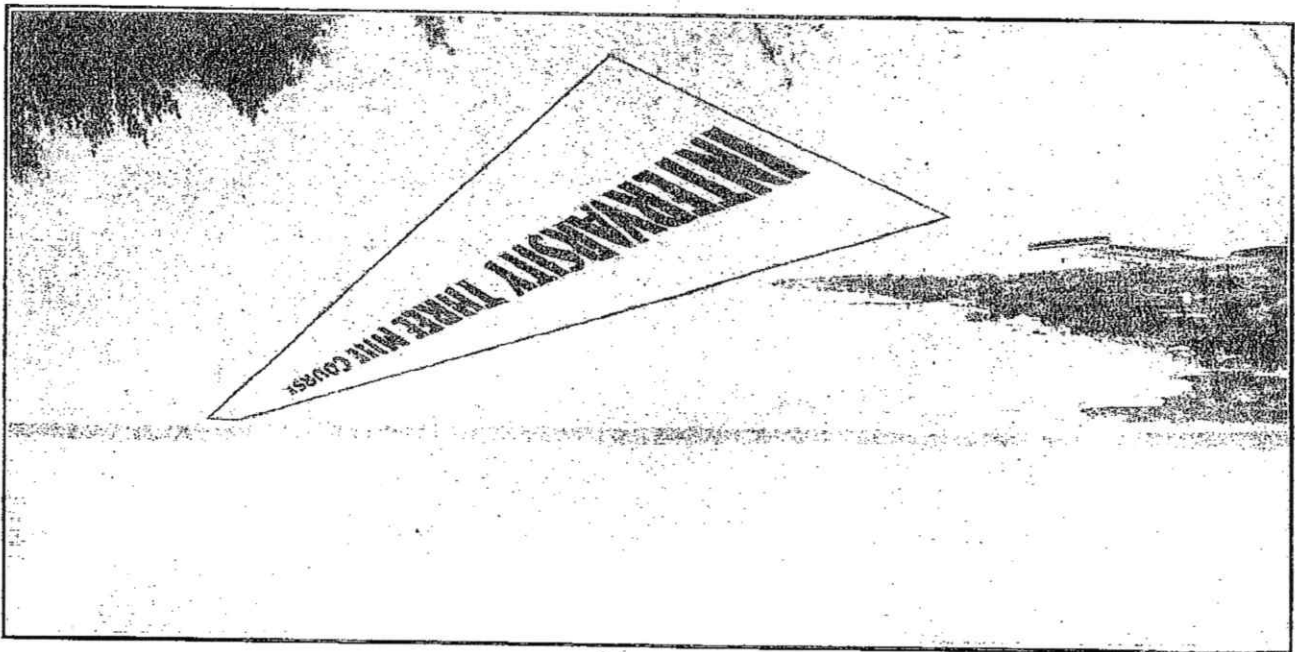

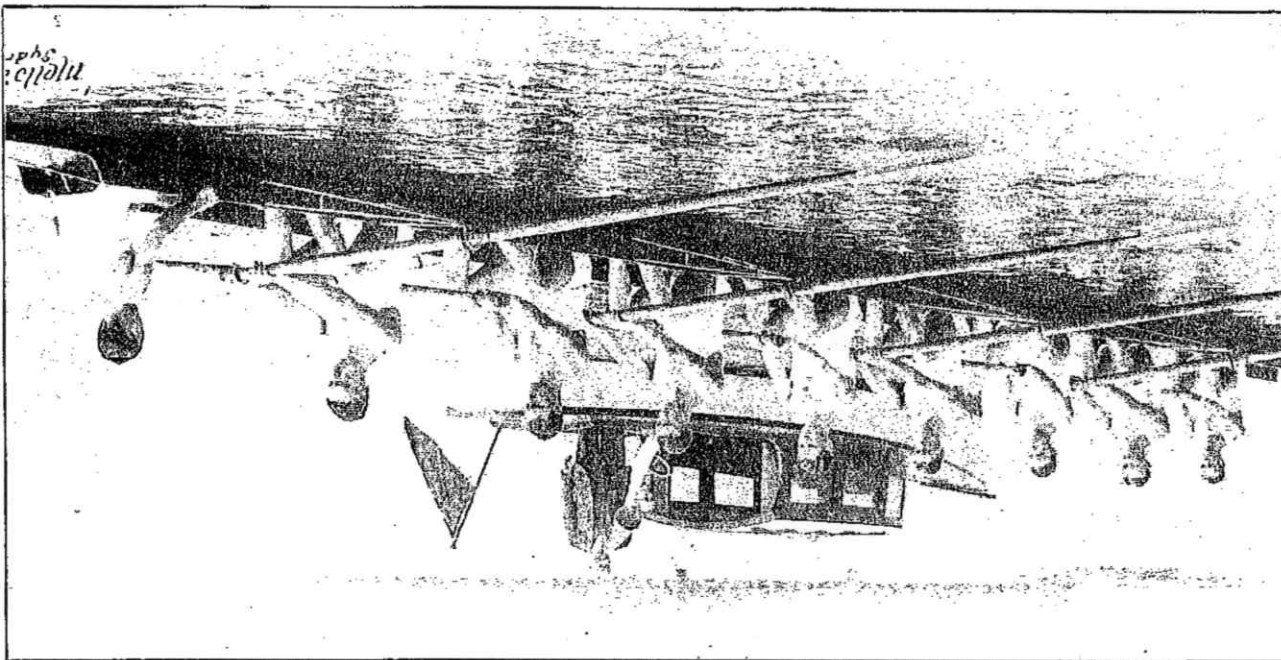
PLAN OF COURSE

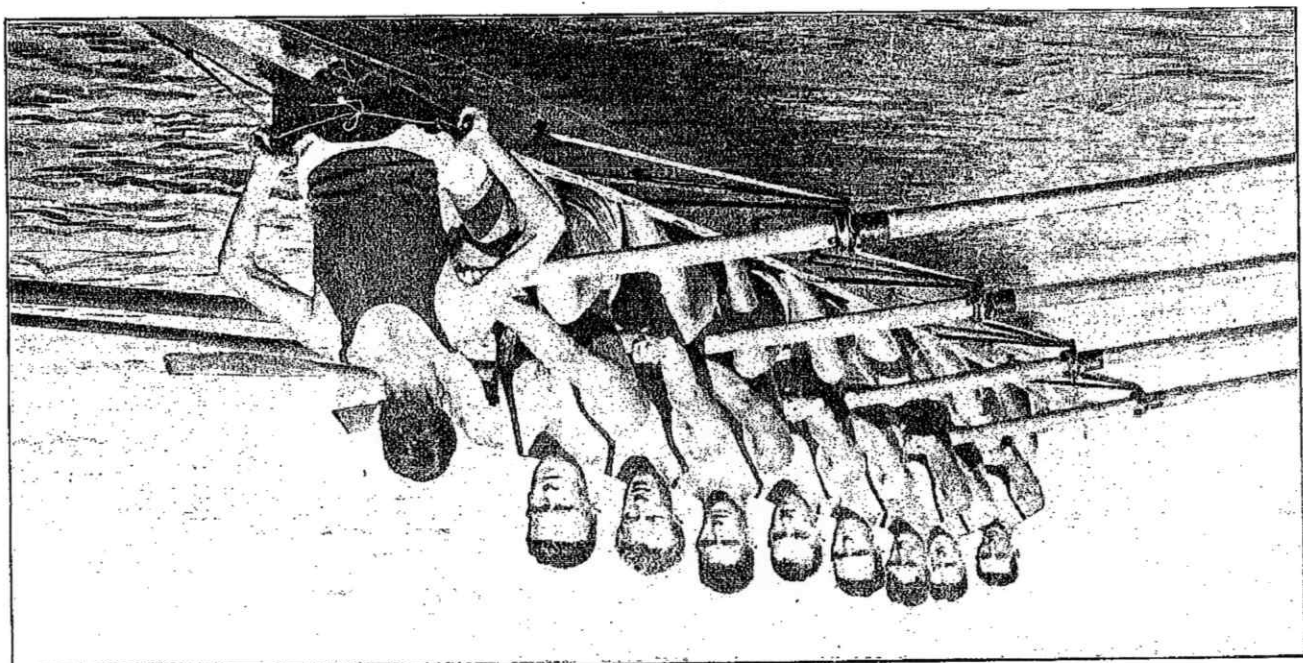
