## THE AUSTRALIAN UNIVERSITIES' ROWING CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Inter-Varsity Boat Race and Rowing Championships is one of the oldest established sporting events in this country.

The first Inter-Varsity boat race was held on December 20th, 1870, between fours representing Sydney and Melbourne Universities, over a three-and-a-half-mile course on the Yarra River. Apart from an event contested by representatives of the States of New South Wales and Victoria on the Parramatta River in 1863, there does not seem to have been any other race of interstate status prior to the 1870 Inter-Varsity. The race was won by Melbourne in 31 mins. 4 secs. The following year a Melbourne four again defeated Sydney, this time on the Parramatta course.

The race was not contested again until 1888, when eights representing Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide Universities met on the Hambourg Reach course. Melbourne was first, with Adelaide second and Sydney third. Sydney, stroked by W.A. Conlon, recorded its first win in 1890, when it won from Melbourne on the Yarra River course. Adelaide, stroked by W.H. Gosse, won for the first time in 1896, defeating Sydney and Melbourne on the Yarra. The race has been rowed every year since 1888 except during the war years, 1915-1918 and 1941-1945. There was no race in 1965 either, following the picnic of 1964 when revelling oarsmen committed mutiny, piracy and other acts upon a Hobart ferry.

In 1896 a most appropriate trophy was provided for the race, when a group of old University "Blues" oarsmen in England presented what is now known as the Oxford and Cambridge Cup as a perpetual trophy to be competed for annually by the Australian Universities. The historic value of such a trophy makes it unique in the field of Australian sport.

Until 1920, only Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide contested the race, but in this year Queensland sent to Melbourne a crew which finished third. In 1921 they came second, and won in 1922 and 1923. E.B. Freeman stroked both winning crews.

In 1924 Tasmania entered a crew, and in 1925 won the race from Sydney in Brisbane. R.A. Scott stroked the winning crew.

Western Australia competed for the first time in 1927, when a crew stroked by F.A. Williams won on the Nepean River course. This was the first occasion on which a crew had won on its first start since the original race in 1870; it was also the first occasion on which all six Australian Universities were represented; and in that same year the Sculling Championship was inaugurated.

In 1956 the University of New South Wales competed for the first time, and Monash entered in 1963. In that year also the Lightweight Fours Championship over 2000 metres was introduced, the event being won by Melbourne in the time of 7 mins. 20 secs.

In 1966 the Australian National University and Newcastle University were both represented, and in 1969 Latrobe entered for the first time.

1969 also saw the controversial shortening of the Oxford and Cambridge Cup course from 2½-3 miles to 2000 metres; the introduction of a race for coxwainless pairs, won by Melbourne in the time of 7 mins. 53.1 secs.; and the first representations in the Sculling Championship by Flinders and Macquarie Universities.

This year the seventy-sixth Australian Universities Boat Race and Rowing Championships will be conducted on the 2000 metre Lake Kurwongbah, Queensland, course, considered by many to be the finest in Australia. This site is to be the venue for the 1972 National Championships, at which oarsmen will be competing for Olympic selection.

May we take this opportunity to extend a welcome to visiting oarsmen, and to wish all competitors in this year's Inter-Varsity the best of luck, and good rowing.






