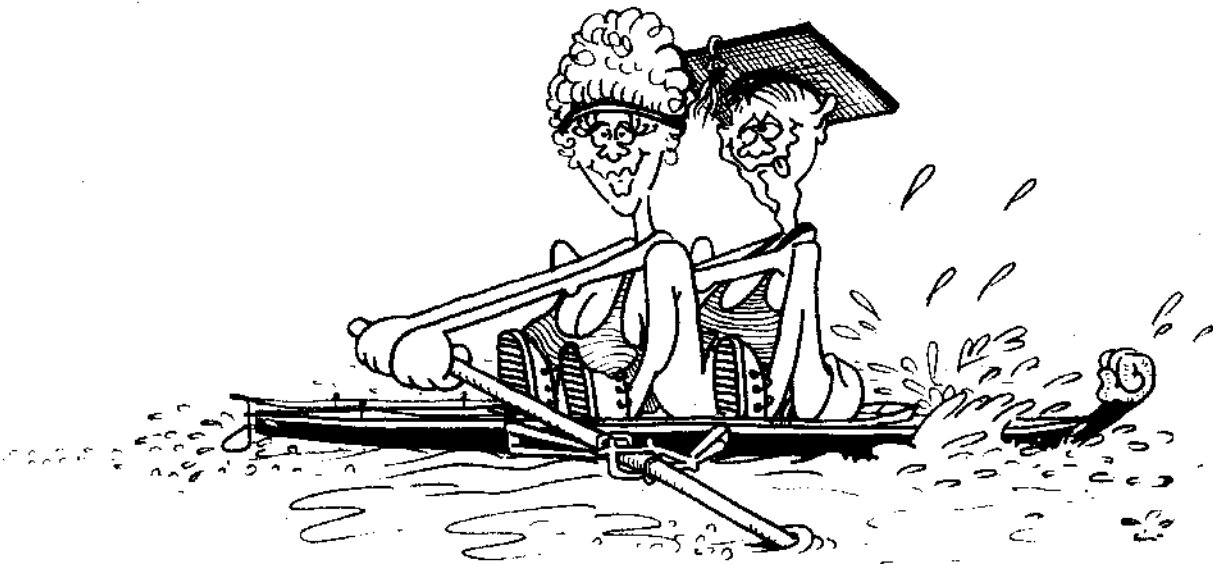

## A SHORT HISTORY OF THE

### AUSTRALIAN UNIVERSITIES' ROWING CONTESTS

The Inter-Varsity Boat Race and Rowing Championships is one of the oldest established sporting events in Australia.

The first Inter-Varsity Boat Race in Australia was held on December 20th, 1870 between four-oared crews representing the Universities of Sydney and Melbourne over a three-and-a-half mile course on the Yarra River. In the week following the Boat Race the participants also took part in the first cricket matches between the two Universities. Apart from an event contested by representatives of the Colonies of New South Wales and Victoria on the Parramatta River in 1863, there does not appear to have been any other contest of interstate status prior to the 1870 Inter-Varsity. The first race was won by Melbourne in 31 minutes 4 seconds. In the succeeding year a Melbourne Four again defeated Sydney, this time on the Parramatta River Course.

The race was not again contested until 1888, when an eight-oared event was staged with crews representing the University of Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide, met on the Hambourg Reach course of the Yarra River. Melbourne was first, Adelaide second some five lengths behinds, with a similar distance to Sydney in third place. Sydney stroked by W.A. Conlon recorded its first win in 1890, when it won from Melbourne on the Yarra course. Adelaide won for the first time in 1896 when a crew stroked by W.H. Gosse defeated Sydney and Melbourne on the Yarra course. The race has been rowed every year since 1888, except during the war years 1915-1918 and 1941-1945. There was no race rowed in 1965.

In 1896 a most appropriate trophy was provided for the Boat Race when Oxford and Cambridge "Blues" presented a cup as a perpetual trophy for the race. The historic value of such a trophy makes it unique in the field of Australian sport.

Until 1920 only Sydney, Melbourne and Adelaide contested the race, but in that year Queensland sent to Melbourne a crew stroked by T.J. Bale which finished in third place. The next year the Queensland University crew came second. In 1922 and 1923 the Queensland Crews won. E.B. Freeman stroked both winning crews.

In 1924 The University of Tasmania contested for the first time. In 1925 its crew, stroked by R.A. Scott, won the race from Sydney in second place at Brisbane.

Western Australia competed for the first time in 1927, when a crew stroked by F.A. Williams won on the Nepean River course in New South Wales. This was the first occasion on which a crew had won at its first start since the original race in 1870: it was also the first occasion at which Universities from all States of the Australian Commonwealth were represented.

In 1956 the University of New South Wales made its first appearance at Inter-Varsity rowing and Monash entered for the first time in 1963. In 1966, the Australian National University and Newcastle University both made their debuts and in 1969 La Trobe entered for the first time. Macquarie University first entered in the eight-oared event in 1973.

The Sculling Championship was introduced in 1927, and it was in this contest for the W.D. & H.O. Wills Trophy that Flinders and Macquarie Universities made their inter-varsity rowing debuts in 1969. The Lightweight Coxed Fours Championship for the Sir Fred J. Schonell Cup was introduced in 1963 over a 2,000 metre course and was won by Melbourne. In 1969 a Coxswainless Pairs Championship over 2,000 metres was introduced with its inaugural contest being won by Melbourne. That year also saw the final break with the notion of the Thames' Putney-Mortlake course of four-and-a-half miles used by Oxford and Cambridge being a suitable model for the Australian Boat Race for the Oxford and Cambridge Cup. All events are now staged over the international standard distance of 2,000 metres on a straight course.

1975 saw the combining of the men's and women's rowing contests in Franklin, Tasmania. The women's events rowed that year were a Coxed Four, Coxed Pair and Single Scull, all events being rowed over 1,000 metres.

The Centenary Cup, donated by the N.S.W. Rowing Association on the occasion of their hundredth anniversary, was introduced in 1978 for an overall points score. In the same year, the Women's Lightweight Fours and a Women's Invitation Eight, were introduced, the Eights and Fours being won by Melbourne.

This year, we are again at the Gold Coast, the previous inter-varsity here, being held in 1971. The venue, Hinze Dam is a beautiful protected course with grassy slopes overlooking the dam, giving very good views of the events.
